

Main Achievements and Highlights in the Last 5 Months


- Recognized for research and training in Black Soldier Fly Larvae as an alternative source of protein in Animal feed

- Restocking with new breeds of cattle(Sahiwals and short horn Zebu) and poultry (Kroiler, Black Ruster, Nyoro indigenous) for learning, research and commercialization
- Successfully switched lectures from face to face to online teaching platforms
- Successfully conducting the second virtual graduation ceremony on 21 May 2021
- Approval by the Ministry of Information and Communication Technology for the opening of up a radio in collaboration with GoU to enhance training and research dissemination in the COVID 19 situation
